Have they got a dog?

### + Kurzantwort

Yes, I have.

Yes, he has.

Yes, she has.

Yes, we have.

Yes, they have.

### - Kurzantwort

No, I haven't.

No, he hasn't.

No, she hasn't.

No, we haven't.

No, they haven't.
