



Mit dem *present progressive* sagst du, dass jemand gerade etwas tut oder dass jetzt etwas passiert.

- Die Verlaufsform bildest du mit einer Form von *to be* (*am, is, are*) und dem Infinitiv (ohne *to*) des Verbs + *ing-Endung*.
z.B. *They are play+ing football.*
- Im Deutschen gibt es die Verlaufsform nicht. Die Bedeutung wird deshalb oft mit gerade, im Moment, im Augenblick oder jetzt ausgedrückt

Besonderheiten beim Schreiben:

write	e	Tom is <i>writing</i> a book	• Verben mit stummen -e am Ende verlieren dieses vor der ing-Endung
put	+ t	Tom is <i>putting</i> a cup ¹ on the table	• Verben mit kurzen Vokal vor dem Endkonsonanten verdoppeln diesen Endkonsonanten.

- You / to go / to the circus.
You are going to the circus.
- Peter / to play / basketball every week.
Peter is playing basketball every week.
- Tom and Klara / to learn / for the English test.
Tom and Klara are learning for the English test.
- I / to eat.
I am eating.
- They / to cook / a meal together,
They are cooking a meal together.

- Jenny **is waiting** (wait) for the train.
- Simon and David **are listening** (listen) to music.
- They **aren't sitting** (not sit) on the bed.
- **Are you going** (you/go) home by car?
- **I'm not shopping** (not shop) in a bookshop at the moment.
- **Is the sun coming out** (the sun/com out) again?
- **Is Thomas dancing** (to dance) at the moment? No, he **isn't** (short answer!). He **is sitting** (to sit) in the classroom.
